Cardboard Boat Specifications

- 1. Minimum Size: There is no minimum size requirement.
- 2. You must build the cardboard boat with Carboard. No wood allowed.
- 3. You must build your own oar/paddle to propel the boat.
- 4. Each cardboard boat should have a catchy theme. Please decorate your boat. No explicit language or inappropriate displays will be allowed.

Rules

The race is open to ALL Ages.

All participants must be present for the Safety Briefing.

Awards - Certificates

Speed Racer Award

The fastest boat in your age group

Captains Award best

For the best driven boat

For the team who completes the course in the fastest amount of time

Titanic Award

For the most dramatic sinking (best effort not to sink)

Team Spirit Award

For the best design and creativity (including boat and crew)

Race Rules

- 1. All Cardboard Boats and Teams must be ready to check-in starting at 4 p.m.
- 2. 2. All boats must be built ahead of time and pass inspection by staff before racing as they come into the facility.
- 3. All participants must wear a bathing suit/shorts. For safety reasons, Us Coast Guard approved Lifejackets are required.
- 4. Participants who start the race must finish without leaving the interior of the boat. If the participant exits the cardboard boat for any reason during the competition, it will result in disqualification.
- 5. Participants are not allowed to sabotage anyone else's boat. Any roughhousing in the water will lead to disqualification.

6. When a team finishes the race, they must remove the boat and any leftover cardboard debris from the

water and dispose of it at the designated trash area.

7. The Winner will be selected by the fastest time and race completed, as long as all rules announced the

day of the competition are followed.

- 8. Judges reserve the right to refuse a team if their Cardboard Boat is deemed unsafe or due to unsportsmanship behavior.
- 9. The decision of the Judges is FINAL.
